



On Receiving Holy Communion in the Orthodox Church

Only Orthodox Christians who are prepared through prayer, fasting, and a recent confession should approach the Chalice for Communion. All others are encouraged to come receive a blessing from the priest and partake of the Holy Bread as they exit the Communion line.

The remainder of the Liturgy concludes as usual.

Kontakion and Ikos

Rising from the tomb, Thou didst raise the dead and resurrect Adam. Eve rejoices in Thy Resurrection; and the ends of the earth rejoice in Thy rising from the dead, O merciful One.

Thou didst despoil the kingdom of Hades, O compassionate One, and raise the dead. Thou didst go before the myrrh-bearers and bring them joy instead of sorrow. Thou didst reveal the signs of victory to Thine Apostles, O my Savior and source of life. Thou didst enlighten all creation, O loving God. Therefore, the world rejoices at Thy rising from the dead, O merciful One.

The Synaxarion

On January 13 in the Holy Orthodox Church we continue to celebrate the Theophany of our Lord Jesus Christ, and we commemorate the holy Martyrs Hermyls and Stratonikos of Belgrade.

Hermyls and Stratonikos' ship was a basket,
wherein they sailed a joint voyage to the bottom.

On the thirteenth the Danube drowned Hermyls and companion.

The Emperor Licinius started a persecution against Christians, and so Hermyls was captured and led to court. When Hermyls was informed that he was being led away to be tortured, he greatly rejoiced. The emperor threatened him in vain. Hermyls responded, "The Lord is with me; I fear not. What can man do against me?" (Psalm 118:6). Following excruciating tortures, Hermyls was thrown into the dungeon. The guard Stratonikos, secretly a Christian, sympathized with the suffering of Hermyls. When it was reported to the emperor that Stratonikos was also a Christian, the emperor ordered that both of them be drowned in the Danube River. Three days later, their bodies washed ashore. Christians discovered their bodies and buried them about eighteen miles from Belgrade. These martyrs suffered for Christ and were glorified in 315.

On this day we also commemorate the Martyrs Pachomios and Papyrinos of Greece; Venerable Maximos Kafsoalyvitis of Athos; Venerable Eleazar of Anzersk Island; and Hilarion, bishop of Poitiers. By the intercessions of Thy Saints, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
